
Happy New Year Everyone!!

Piles of gifts and blankets from the Iowa City Moose Lodge Tuesday began traveling to two low-income, Johnson County families.

Members of the lodge, an organization dedicated to helping children and elderly people, gathered the gifts and blankets throughout December after working with the Salvation Army in Iowa City to identify families in need.

Lodge members and a Salvation Army representative Tuesday loaded the brightly wrapped items into boxes so the Salvation Army could deliver them to the families.

Linda Riggs, a senior regent at the lodge, was among Women of the Moose members who organized the gift drive, which the lodge holds annually. She said the families asked for basic necessities, such as car seats, winter clothing, baby formula and curtains. "It was very humbling," she said.

Rachel Lehmann, Salvation Army's Social Ministries coordinator and Pathway of Hope case manager, said the Salvation Army worked with the two families to compile wish lists for the Moose Lodge. She said their needs ranged from simple necessities to toys and household items.

"This is going to be life-changing. I mean, truly life-changing for these families," Lehmann said.

She said the Moose Lodge is among four organizations in the local area the Salvation Army worked with on adopting families for the holidays this year.

Dawn Brenneman, a member of the lodge, organized the blanket drive to benefit homeless people in the Iowa City area. She said she collected roughly 40 blankets for the Salvation Army to distribute and raised more than \$100 to buy additional blankets through a dinner and a raffle at the lodge.

"There's a lot of homeless people and people that just don't always have a warm blanket to cover up with," she said.

Janet Enderle, a Moose Lodge officer, said members of the Iowa City Country Line Dancers group helped the lodge organize the gift drive. She said as a member of the lodge since 2008, she has helped with the annual drive for nearly a decade.

Enderle said she was excited about working with the Salvation Army to identify families this year, saying the non-profit organization is "very dear to our hearts."

B.J. Monroe, a past officer in the lodge, said she was stricken by the simplicity of the families' requests and said the gift drive is always a rewarding experience.

"They wanted necessities, not fancy, expensive things. They wanted necessities to get through their days with, which impressed me," Monroe said.



TOMMY MOOSE PROGRAM


